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Fund Manager's Commentary

The Money Market remained mostly short on liquidity for the month of October, 2009. State Bank of Pakistan conducted frequent open market operations to inject liquidity in the market.

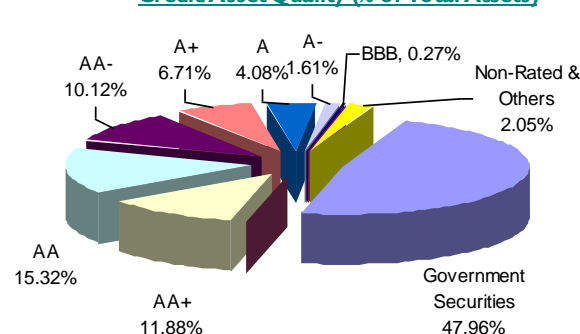
SBP conducted its fortnightly T-Bill auction on 8th Oct 2009; participation of PKR 76 billion at high yields was witnessed against a target of PKR 30 billion. SBP however auctioned a total of PKR 22.9 billion worth of T-Bills. Cut off Rates for 12 month T-bills were increased by 7 bps to 12.5384, whereas the cut off rates for 3-months T-bill were reduced by 7 bps to 12.4929. Cut off rates for 6 month T-Bills remained unchanged. The second auction during the month was conducted on 22nd Oct 2009, and a total pre-cipitation of PKR 62 billion was witnessed against the auction target of PKR 25 billion. SBP auctioned PKR 24.2 billion worth of T-bills. Cut off rates in the 3 month tenor increased by 5 bps to 12.5429 where as the cut off rates for 3 and 6 month T-bills remained unchanged.

KIBOR showed an increasing trend during the month as 1-Month KIBOR started off at 12.74% and closed at 12.80%. The average 1-Month KIBOR increased by 7 basis points to 12.80% in October 2009 compared to 12.73% in September 2009

TFC prices on selective securities showed increase, however the trading activity remained dull throughout the month.

Funds exposure in TFC reduced from 51.18% to 43.24% of the Fund size, a decline of around 8%. This decrease was mainly due to increase in fund size from fresh investments and some divestment of TFCs.

Fund Manager's Commentary

The Money Market remained mostly short on liquidity for the month of October, 2009. State Bank of Pakistan conducted frequent open market operations to inject liquidity in the market.

KIBOR showed an increasing trend during the month as 1-Month KIBOR started off at 12.74% and closed at 12.80%. The average 1-Month KIBOR increased by 7 basis points to 12.80% in October 2009 compared to 12.73% in September 2009

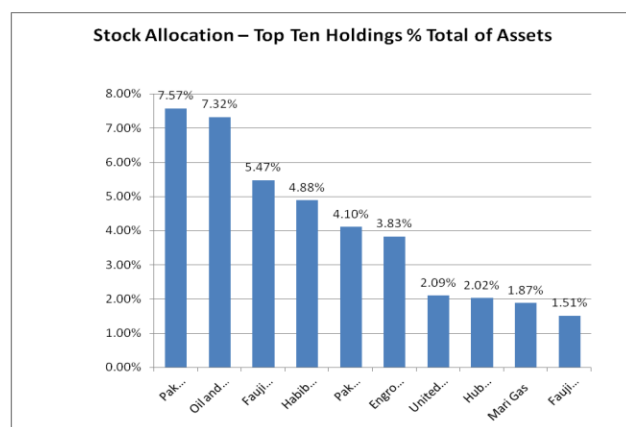
TFC prices on selective securities showed increase, however the trading activity remained dull throughout the month.

Funds exposure in TFC reduced from 51.18% to 43.24% of the Fund size, a decline of around 8%. This decrease was mainly due to increase in fund size from fresh investments and some divestment of TFCs.

KSE 100 index remained volatile throughout the month. Starting at 9,349 points it closed at 9,159 points after making high of 9,978 and low of 8,971. The volatility was a result of sharp movement in the shares triggered by various events including, Waziristan operation, terrorist attacks & various news on the economic & political fronts. The foreign investment inflow in the equity market also declined from \$128.34 million in Sep 09 to \$ 38.34 million in Oct 09. The average daily trading volume also decreased by 16.25% to 214.9 million compared to 256.6 million shares during September 09.

Decline in CPI on Y/Y basis, lower trade deficit, record high remittance and increasing reserves were the positive news on economic front. As per Central Bank reported figures, CPI increased by 10.12% in Sept on YoY basis, which is the lowest increase since December 2007. The MoM trend also witnessed tamed inflation numbers down to 0.45%, compared to 1.7% reported in the previous month. Remittance in the 1st quarter FY10 stood at around \$ 2.3 billion, up 24% on Y/Y basis which coupled with lower trade deficit (down to \$ 3.09 billion in 1QFY10, compared to \$ 4.40 billion in the same period last year) and higher reserve level (\$14.49 billion) is expected to keep Foreign & local investor interest alive.

There are challenges ahead in the backdrop of Waziristan operation, keeping inflation close to FY10 target of approximately 10% and achieving economic target set in the Budget 2009-10.

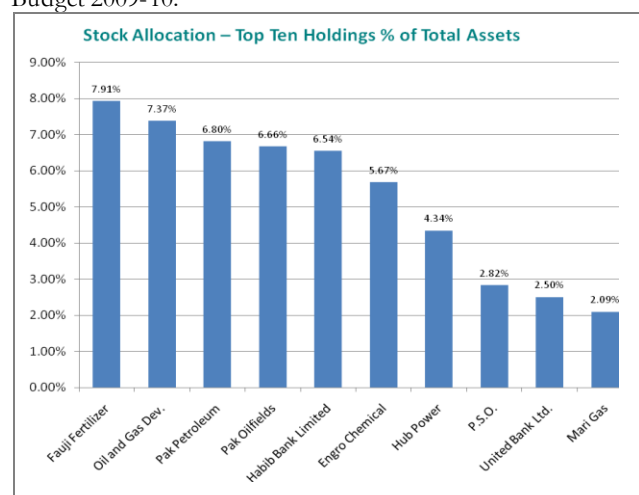
